MOSES was a man of influence with God. At his word, a plague would begin; and at his word, a plague would stop. God backed His servant, Moses, in a mighty way. (God will back you in a mighty way, too.)

Moses demonstrated the power of God in a marvelous way through signs, wonders, and miracles in Egypt as he delivered the Children of Israel out of Egyptian bondage. He brought out the people, who had been in bondage and slavery for generations, *“With much silver and gold and there was not one feeble person among their tribes”* (Psalm 105:37). The Lord shall fight for you and you shall hold your peace” (Exodus 14:13-14). That was some big, bold talk on Moses’ part, wasn’t it?

He then went into his own tent and fell down, *cried*, and *complained* like a baby before God! Yes, mighty Moses himself fell into the trap of discouragement, crying, and complaining to God. *“And the Lord said unto Moses, **wherefore do you cry unto me?** Speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward”* (Exodus 14:15).

God spoke to Moses and it saved his life. God basically said, *“Shut up, and get up, and do something in faith so I can help you.”* (As you know, Moses then stretched forth his rod, and the Red Sea parted and the people passed through on dry ground (Exodus 14:21-22).
