

Greetings Champion!

Proverbs 10:22 GWT, *"It is the Lord's blessing that makes a person rich, and hard work adds nothing to it."*

I have been sharing with you a huge truth from the Bible that has been neglected for hundreds of years. It's called "The Blessing." In my book with the same title, I share how "The Blessing" was first given to Adam and Eve, later to Abraham, then to Isaac, then to Jacob, then to the children of Israel, and today it has been given to us.

Romans 4 and Galatians 3 and 4, connect us to Abraham and Isaac, therefore I have been sharing with you what "The Blessing" did for them and encouraging you to believe God that the very same **blessing** is in your life (Galatians 3:13-14).

Abraham told the oldest servant of his house to go find a wife for his son Isaac, from Abraham's country and kindred (Genesis 24:2-4). Abraham assured his servant that God would send His angel before him to guard him and prosper his way (Genesis 24:7). The servant went to Mesopotamia, unto the city of Nahor (verse 10) and found Rebecca, Isaac's cousin, and later Isaac and Rebecca were married (verse 15, 67).

The servant of Abraham gave an accounting of Abraham's status to Rebecca's family. He said, *"The Lord has blessed my master greatly; and he is become great; and God has given him flocks, and herds, and silver, and gold, and menservants, and maidservants, and camels, and asses"* (Genesis 24:35). In other words, Rebecca was marrying into wealth.

When you received Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, you were born into wealth. It's time to find out about the wonderful inheritance Jesus provided for you.
