

Greetings Champion!

Jesus invites you to *"ask anything you want in prayer, and it shall be done for you"* if you simply live in Him and allow His Words to live in you (John 15:7).

I have been teaching about what the Bible says concerning prayer on my "Pillars of Faith Christian" app for several weeks. I'm teaching from my book, *"Asking and Receiving God's Unlimited Provision."* I would like to share an excerpt from the book with you.

Jesus taught us to pray, *"Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven"* (Matthew 6:10). Is it God's Will for men to be sick when they get to heaven? Is it God's Will for men to be defeated and poverty-stricken and unhappy in heaven? Is it God's Will for men to be tormented by the curse in heaven? Is it God's Will for the works of the devil to exist and thrive in their spirits, souls, and bodies in heaven? Is it God's Will in heaven for men to be abandoned by God and forsaken by Him after they once get there? I hope you know the answers to those questions.

Pain, suffering, insufficiency, and things the Bible calls *the curse* are not God's Will in heaven, and therefore cannot be God's Will on earth because God is not schizophrenic and doesn't have two opposing personalities and wills.

As a matter of fact, God promised us that, *"No evil will befall you,"* in Psalm 91:10. It turns out that the word *"evil"* in the Hebrew language is *"ra',"* pronounced *"rah',"* and means, *bad, disagreeable, malignant, unpleasant, giving pain, unhappiness, misery, displeasing, sad, unhappy, hurtful, vicious in disposition, wicked, anything causing misery, injury, calamity, distress, adversity, or affliction.* (Source: Strong's Concordance of the Hebrew Language.)

Since God's character and nature is exactly the opposite of *"Evil,"* it would therefore be impossible for Him to communicate, or be in agreement with, and *"will"* anything from the above definition of evil to come on any of His children. (Just knock the "D" off devil and you have *"evil"* and know where the problem came from.)

God only wants the very best for you. You've got to know that and believe it with all of your heart.
