

Jehovah-Shalom

Jehovah-Shalom. The redemptive name, Jehovah-Shalom, is found in Judges 6:24 and means, “The Lord our Peace,” revealing to us the redemptive privilege of having supernatural peace. Accordingly, Jesus (the Prince of peace) says, “My peace I give unto thee” in John 14:27.

The Redemptive Name Given

Judges 6:24 KJV

*Then Gideon built an altar there unto the LORD, and called it **Jehovahshalom**: unto this day it is yet in Ophrah of the Abiezrites.*

The Redemptive Name Fulfilled in Christ

John 14:27 KJV

*Peace I leave with you, **my peace I give unto you**: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.*

John 16:33 KJV

*These things I have spoken unto you, that **in me ye might have peace**. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world.*

Romans 5:1 KJV

*Therefore being justified by faith, **we have peace with God** through our Lord Jesus Christ:*

Ephesians 2:13-15 KJV

*But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For **he is our peace** (fulfilling Jehovah-Shalom), who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, **so making peace**.*

Philippians 4:7 KJV

*And the **peace** of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.*

This blessing of peace is in the Atonement, (the redemptive work of Jesus Christ) because “**The chastisement of our peace was on Him**” (Isaiah 53:5) when “**He made peace by the blood of His cross for us**” (Colossians 1:20).

The world might rent an RV (motor home) and take a vacation to get away from the stress of civilization, and try to find peace.

But you have “*The Jesus kind and quality of peace*” that the world knows nothing about. You have supernatural peace in the midst of any storm of life, knowing how much God loves you.

From Judges 6:24, the word translated peace is Shalom (or Shalown). It means “welfare, health, prosperity, peace, favor, rest, safety, and all is well.”

Those words are included in the meaning of Jehovah-Shalom.
