

Greetings Champion!

Realize that since *all* (not some) of God's promises are "Yes" and "Amen," God can never say, "Wait," "Maybe," and He can never say, "No" when it comes to fulfilling His promises. The Bible says God can only say, "Yes and Amen" to what He has promised (2 Corinthians 1:20).

God's reason for promising to heal our body, meet our needs, and answer our prayers is so faith could be developed in us to believe the promise so God could then fulfill His promise to us.

God doesn't just *sometimes* say, "Yes" to your prayer, He *always* says, "Yes" to what He has promised. The reason God made the promise in the first place was to give it to you.

Hebrews 7:22, NIV, "*Jesus has become the guarantor of a better covenant.*" That means, if anything in the better Covenant fails, Jesus fails, because He is the guarantee that it will not fail.

Not just that!...

Ephesians 1:13-14, GNT, "*And you also became God's people when you heard the true message, the Good News that brought you salvation. You believed in Christ, and God put his stamp of ownership on you by giving you the Holy Spirit he had promised. <sup>14</sup> The Spirit is the guarantee that we shall receive what God has promised his people, and this assures us that God will give complete freedom to those who are his. Let us praise his glory!*"

So, from the two passages of scripture given above, it is clear that if the promises of God fail to materialize for us, or the fulfillment of God's promises suddenly become unavailable or unattainable to us, both Jesus and the Holy Spirit will fail.

That can't happen!
